FAMILY DEVOTIONAL GUIDE
<p><i>This week’s passages are based on the three points of Sunday’s sermon,</i></p> <p><i>“If We Say” from 1 John 1:6-10.</i></p>
<p><b>Day 1</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Scripture:</b> 1 John 1:6-7</li> <li><b>Discussion:</b> This section addresses the issue of <b>selfishness</b>. Walking in darkness (sinning) flows from selfishness (James 1:14). In what ways have you seen that selfishness leads to sin? Discuss the significance of “walk in the light” (v. 7) being the answer to selfishness.</li> <li><b>Song:</b> “The Heart of Worship” by Matt Redman</li> </ul>
<p><b>Day 2</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Scripture:</b> 1 John 1:8</li> <li><b>Discussion:</b> This section addresses the issue of <b>self-righteousness</b>. John states that anyone claiming to be sinless is a self-deceiving liar. Have you experienced the tendency to deny your own sinfulness? What are the most obvious ways we tend to downplay our own sin? Spend some time confessing your sins to the Lord and renewing your commitment to walk in holiness.</li> <li><b>Song:</b> “I Need Thee Every Hour” by Annie S. Hawks &amp; Robert Lowry</li> </ul>
<p><b>Day 3</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Scripture:</b> 1 John 1:10</li> <li><b>Discussion:</b> This section addresses the issue of <b>spiritual pride</b>. In the notes, Bro. Tom makes the point that there isn’t really an “answer” to spiritual pride. The reality is that we must forsake sin and just let pride go. As we do, humility will come. Otherwise, there’s no other way to get rid of pride in our lives. Humility is a byproduct of confession of sin, and it requires humility to acknowledge sin, confess sin, and repent of sin. Spend some time asking the Lord to help you walk in holiness and repent of any spiritual pride.</li> <li><b>Song:</b> “We Fall Down” by Chris Tomlin</li> </ul>

<p><b>YOURS FOR JESUS’ SAKE ... A WORD FROM BROTHER TOM ....</b></p> <p><b><u>If We Say</u></b></p> <p>The <b>Southern Baptist Convention</b> will hold its annual meeting next week in Nashville. The meeting is one of the most significant gatherings of the convention in many years. Last year’s meeting was cancelled because of overblown concerns regarding the pandemic. Registration for messengers is over 14,500 for this year, about double the attendance in recent years. You might ask, why the dramatic increase? Rank and file Southern Baptists are, it seems, concerned about a new and pressing liberal drift in our seminaries and other entities. As a trustee of one of our institutions (The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary) I have become aware of a subtle but sure drift toward more liberal approaches and compromise with culture (see: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=GB-DrUrBoEQ&amp;t=23s">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=GB-DrUrBoEQ&amp;t=23s</a>)</p> <p>We are also aware of the <b>complete and utter failure of the Ethics and Religious Liberties Commission</b> (ERLC) to accurately represent Southern Baptists as the public policy arm of our convention. Dr. Russell Moore, who recently resigned as a head of the ERLC, has left the denomination spewing hatred and ill will toward anyone who dared disagree with his liberal politics. He was really nothing more than an operative for the DNC. The last time the convention met was in Birmingham in 2019. The convention messengers, uninformed and lied to, made the tragic error of passing a resolution that was positive toward Critical Race Theory (CRT; it was known as <u>Resolution 9</u>). A new resolution, titled <u>Resolution on the Incompatibility of Critical Race Theory and Intersectionality with The Baptist Faith and Message</u>, drafted by Pastor Mike Stone, is in the plans for this year’s convention which will hopefully be passed to correct the missteps of the previous one. Pray that it will be accepted and presented without changes by the Resolutions Committee.</p> <p>I am looking forward to our continued study of <b>First John</b>. This week looking at chapter one, verses 6-10), and consider a message <i>“If We Say.”</i> John’s concern was that our profession be equaled by our practice. We can have a profession of deception. John says “if we say” one thing and do another then we are lying, or worse we are deceived. There is an answer, and we’ll cover it Sunday.</p> <p><b>FAMILY WOW (Worship on Wednesday)</b>- continues this week and we have doubled our average attendance!
