DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR INSTRUCTION

- **Doctrine** What does this truth teach us about: the Bible, God/the Trinity, Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit, man, salvation, the church, the end times?
- Law How does this truth relate to the 10 commandments and God's law?
- **Gospel** How does this truth relate to the gospel of Jesus Christ?

PRAYER ROOM MESSAGE

God's Commanding Will is the aspect of God's will relating only to His children because only they have the capacity to obey Him completely with willing hearts. So when we pray "Your will be done" we're praying for (1) the use of sin's consequences for God's eternal plan, (2) the salvation of people who don't know God, and (3) the obedience of each believer to God's commands. We must abandon our will for God's will. That's what being alone with God is all about! We're to be completely dependent on God and live in obedience to His will.

"Therefore, I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God which is your spiritual service of worship. And do not be conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewing of your mind so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect." Romas 12:1-2
