Day 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Scripture: 1 John 2:1• Discussion: One of the reasons that the apostle John wrote the book of 1st John was so that believers might live in holiness and purity (1 John 2:1—“so that you may not sin”). Spend some time searching the book of 1st John for passages that would help us not to sin. Based on what you find, what practical changes can you make in your life to walk in greater holiness?• Song: “Take My Life (Holiness)” by Scott Underwood
Day 2	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Scripture: 1 John 2:1• Discussion: John refers to Jesus as our advocate. Discuss the significance of having Christ as our advocate. Why is it important to understand that lost people do not have Christ as their advocate? How might this impact both our understanding of our security in Christ as well as the need for urgency in winning the lost to the Lord Jesus Christ?• Song: “Facing a Task Unfinished” by Ed Cash, Fionán De Barra, Frank Houghton, Keith Getty, Kristyn Getty, Samuel Wesley
Day 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Scripture: 1 John 2:2; Ephesians 2:14• Discussion: Christ is our advocate, and He is also our propitiation (1 John 2:2). Propitiation means that Christ appeased God’s wrath and brought the peace that restored us to a right relationship with God. This connects well with Paul’s words in Ephesians 2:14, “He himself is our peace.” Spend some time discussing the implications of Christ being “our peace” and take a moment to express gratitude to the Lord for the shed blood of Jesus by which we have been saved.• Song: “The Blood Will Never Lose Its Power” by Andraé Crouch

<p>YOURS FOR JESUS’ SAKE ... A WORD FROM BROTHER TOM</p> <p><u>CRT and the SBC</u></p> <p>Brother Kenny, Melissa and I are currently attending the Southern Baptist Convention in Nashville. The meeting is one of the most significant gatherings of the convention in many years. Registration was over 15,000, double the recent average. You may already realize that I am somewhat repeating myself from last week. But this meeting of the convention was as crucial to the survival of our denomination as any since 1979. I asked you to pray diligently for the meetings but the efforts of conservatives to the right of the ship have failed. Pastor Mike Stone ended up in a runoff for President and lost by about 500 votes to a moderate, Ed Litton of Alabama. This is tragic in my opinion. Unfortunately, not enough rank and file Southern Baptists care enough about their denomination to attend the convention and do something about it. The SBC has literally gone to hell in a handbasket. As a trustee of one of our institutions (The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary) I have become aware of a subtle but sure drift toward more liberal approaches and compromise with culture (see: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=GB-DrUrBoEQ&t=23s)</p> <p>The Conservative Baptist Network worked hard to warn of the dangers of the unbiblical worldview of Critical Race Theory. They endorsed Bro. Mike Stone for President. Unfortunately, it was not enough. A resolution designed to deal with the issues of CRT and Intersectionality was watered down by the Resolutions Committee, and in spite of efforts from the floor to give it more teeth, the resolution passed in its watered-down form. If you don’t know what CRT/I is or means you better find out. It’s coming to a business, school, church and/or government agency near you. The old ship of the SBC is going down. We will have to reconsider our missions giving.</p> <p>I am looking forward to our continued study of First John. This week am planning, tentatively, to move on to Chapter 2. However, I may move in a different direction. Next Sunday is Father’s Day and I am so grateful for the godly influence of my dad, Ed Rush. He set a great example of faithfulness to God, his family and good conservative values that are what has made our nation great. I have tried to model that in my own life.</p> <p>FAMILY WOW (Worship on Wednesday)- continues this week and we have doubled our average attendance!
