Message from Kenny.

I just wanted to take a moment to say thank you to each one of you who prayed, called, texted or left a comment on Facebook. I'm reminded once again that I'm a blessed man to have so many people care about me. I'm at home now and feeling okay. I can after walking around the house that I'm not quite back to normal and that I'm not doing as good as I probably feel just yet. I know healing takes time, and I'm probably going to be resting for a couple weeks.

This morning I was able to get further information from a nurse regarding my condition. The fuller information is below, but I had two very bad blockages (80% in the LAD and 90% in the first diagonal branch). The LAD is commonly referred to as the "widow maker." They felt it was best only to do the more urgent areas, so they put in two stents yesterday. In two weeks, I'll go back for the less urgent ones and receive two more stents (see the 2nd part in the pic).

I'm grateful that the Lord allowed it to get big enough to be noticed, but not big enough to be fatal. I know some of you thought I was ignoring symptoms last weekend (Sept. 19-20), but you may not know I had several tests during the spring and summer and the cardiologist ruled everything out and basically told me he thought I was fine. I also did not have all the classic markers of a heart attack, aside from some very mild pain in my jaw on the 19th that quickly subsided. It didn't necessarily feel like what seemed like a heart attack. Due to several cardiology visits, Melissa and I made the joint decision to monitor it. Both Saturday and Sunday's episodes quickly abated and did not resurface during the work week, and we both considered it a fluke.

This Saturday's attack (Sept. 26) was much more severe. I was sitting down reading my Bible when the severe pain hit. The best way I know to describe it is like swallowing something and having it go down the wrong pipe. However, the pain didn't go away. My lower teeth were aching, and I knew that was an ominous sign. I become extremely sweaty and pale, and I told Melissa as soon as she was ready I needed her to drive my to the ER. She later joked that she knew it was serious when she came back home to find I had only finished half of my coffee!

After we got to the ER, my nurse was still wondering if it was acid reflux since I felt the pain more in my esophagus and never had pain shooting down my left arm or other symptoms. Blood tests quickly showed elevated troponin (0.3), an enzyme present in muscle and heart damage that tries to assist the body in repair and is a common sign of heart attacks. A couple hours later, my troponin levels had tripled to 1.8, at which point 3 doctors came into the room, and I knew it was serious. I later found out those troponin levels had spiked to 4.7 on Saturday afternoon.

The procedure to put in the stents was performed perfectly on Sunday evening, and I was released at 2 PM today. My goal now is to get back in shape and eating healthy & exercising again. While unhealthy living is a big part of my problem, the other big part of the health puzzle is being at least the 4th generation in my mom's family to experience early heart attacks. My great-grandmother had a fatal heart attack in her early 50s, my grandmother in her early 40s (also fatal), and Mom barely survived hers at age 50. Knowing my history helped get the ball rolling in the ER, in spite of being told I looked good for someone experiencing a heart attack or that due to my age it was probably acid reflux.

I am not sure why the Lord chose to spare my life, but I'm thankful my wife is not a widow nor is my little girl fatherless. Whatever specific reasons He had for sustaining my life, I know the biggest reason is to bring Him glory until my dying breath, hopefully many years from now.
