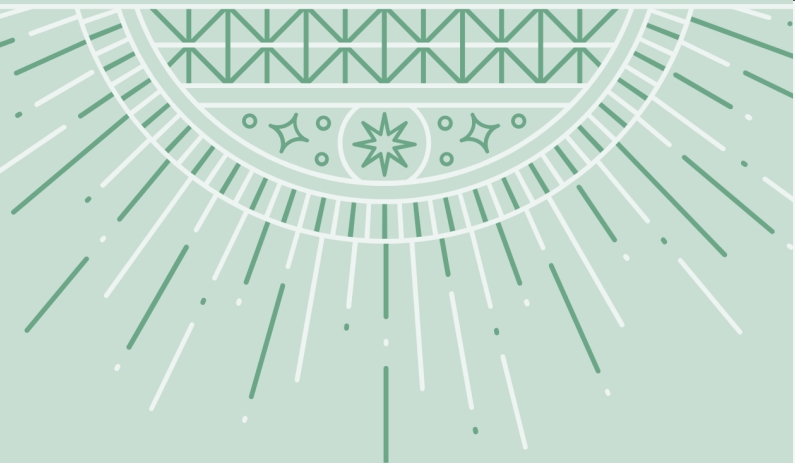

FAMILY DEVOTIONAL GUIDE
<p>This week’s FDG is taken from Sinclair Ferguson’s book, <i>To Seek and To Save: Daily Reflections on the Road to the Cross</i>. It begins with Luke 9:51 where it states that Jesus began focusing His attention on His impending crucifixion. Ferguson then focuses on encounters Jesus had as he journeyed toward the cross. This week’s devotional guide features three of those encounters.</p>
<p><b>Day 1</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Scripture:</b> Luke 20:46-21:4</li><li>• <b>Discussion:</b> “The real issue isn’t ultimately about money, is it? It’s about the heart. But too often our money sticks to our heart. It’s wonderful that Jesus noticed this widow. If anything, it’s even more wonderful that he saw someone give everything she had to the Lord... In that respect, in her own small way, this dear widow was Jesus-like. Reflect: When you became a disciple of Jesus, you gave him all you are and have. But have you gradually been taking it back? What difference does it make to remember that Jesus gave everything he had for you?” (p. 99, “The Poor Widow”)</li><li>• <b>Song:</b> “I Give You My Heart” by Reuben Morgan</li></ul>
<p><b>Day 2</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Scripture:</b> Luke 22:31-38</li><li>• <b>Discussion:</b> “It is surely one of the mysteries of God’s providence in Peter’s life—and also in our own lives—that without minimizing his failure, God seemed to build it into the way he was preparing him to be an under-shepherd of his frail and sometimes straying flock. Our God is able to make all things work together for good for those who love him. So whatever we’ve done in the past, our lives need not be fruitless. Failure is never final when Jesus prays for us. <b>Reflect:</b> We are not preserved in the Christian life by our own courage, strength or wisdom, but only by the intercession of Jesus, without which none of us would be able to stand. How does that truth encourage or challenge you?” (p. 110, “The Self-Deceiving Apostle”)</li><li>• <b>Song:</b> “Change My Heart, Oh God” by Eddie Espinosa</li></ul>
<p><b>Day 3</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Scripture:</b> Luke 22:47-53, 63-65</li><li>• <b>Discussion:</b> “Among them is the promise of Moses: ‘The Lord said to me...“I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their brothers. And I will put my words in his mouth, and he shall speak to them all that I command him”’ (Deuteronomy 18:17-18)... Jesus stands before them, the Divine Seer, whom they blindfold. He is the one on whose lips are God’s words, yet they slap him on the mouth. He is the prophet promised by Moses. But they are too blind to recognise him. <b>Reflect:</b> These events are simply another violent episode in human history—unless we understand what God was doing in them: “For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God” (2 Corinthians 5:21). Re-read these verses in Luke, pausing periodically to remember that it was all for your sake.” (pp. 115-116, “The Temple Soldiers”)</li><li>• <b>Song:</b> “Hallelujah! <p><b>YOURS FOR JESUS’ SAKE ... A WORD FROM BROTHER TOM ...</b></p> <p><u><b>Humility</b></u></p> <p><b>Thank you AGAIN, Tabernacle</b>, for your many expressions of concern, prayer and sympathy regarding the loss of my son, Tim. You continue to be extremely kind and gracious, and I am humbled by your love. Speaking of humility, I am seeking this grace among the many God has called us to emulate. With the help of the Holy Spirit, I am trying to exhibit a Christlike response to the handling of the suffering I have been facing. I know that others have faced more severe troubles. I know that my own situation could be worse. I know that trusting God and believing in His sovereign plan and purpose is my source of strength. I am trying with God’s help to live in the light of His glory and grace.</p> <p>Recently, two things were said to me that I felt most unworthy of. First, someone said, “I see Jesus all over you!” What a gracious compliment and I do wish it were true. Another friend compared me to Job. I am not worthy of such lofty company. While I am appreciative of words clearly meant for encouragement and as a compliment, I do not feel like I am on a par with Job, nor that Jesus is magnified so clearly in my life. But I can say with complete honesty that is what I am striving for.</p> <p>Humility in this regard is a hard hill to climb. It has been said that humility is one of those things that as soon as you are sure you have obtained it is then that you have clearly lost it. It really is an oxymoron to be proud of your humility! But the Word tells us to humble ourselves in the sight of the Lord. It tells us that He will then lift us up (Jas. 4:10). Therefore, your prayers remain much appreciated as I walk this road learning to lean on the Lord and grow in humility. I invite you to join me on the path.</p> <p>God willing, we will complete chapter 11 in the <b>book of Daniel</b> this coming Sunday, March 28. We will learn how Antiochus Epiphanes foreshadowed the coming Antichrist who will rule the world one day from a human perspective.</p> <p>Please continue to be in prayer for our service on <b>Easter Sunday, April 4</b>. We are encouraging each church member to pray for 5 people over the 5 weeks we have leading up to Resurrection Day. Of course, we want you to invite them to join us at TBC for a great day of worshiping the Risen the Lord. We will sing and preach the Gospel.</p> <p>This Wednesday, March 24, we will continue the study of the book “The Church,” chapter 11, looking at the <b>Elements of Worship</b>. We will have more to say about the regulative approach to worship.</p> <p>As always, I am <i>looking forward to what God will do at Tabernacle this coming Sunday</i>.
